

TREATMENT SUMMARY

PATIENT:

KENNETT, Teresa Marie

DIAGNOSIS:

Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, nodular, small cleaved cell type, st. IV

The patient came under my care on November 11, 1986. At that time she was a 37 year old female who was complaining of tightness in the throat, shortness of breath, pain in the posterior aspect of the neck, pain in the right upper quadrant of the abdomen, back ache especially during the night, and abdominal distention. She was in good health until July, 1984 when she developed abdominal pain and was diagnosed with stage non-Hodgkin's lymphoma with massive intraabdominal involvement and involvement of bone marrow. The patient did not have any established treatment for her condition and was taking only a dietary approach - vitamins and minerals, including selenium. In spite of her dietary management, her disease continued to progress. Pretreatment evaluation found the presence of enlarged lymph nodes in the left occipital area and in the right supraclavicular area. The MRI scan on November 13, 1986 has shown enlargement of the spleen and retroperitoneal lymph nodes.

involved treatment program The initial patient's administration of Antineoplaston A10 and AS2-1 capsules and low dose Cytoxan given orally. It was discontinued on February 15, 1988, because of slow response. On February 16, 1988 the patient began the treatment with intravenous infusions of Antineoplaston AlO. On September 7, 1988 Antineoplaston AS2-1 infusions were added to the treatment. Such treatment continued until May 29, 1989. The patient was found to be in complete remission at that time and was advised to take maintenance treatment with Antineoplaston AS2-1 capsules. Such treatment was discontinued on March 6, 1990. She continues to be in complete remission since then and is off treatment.
